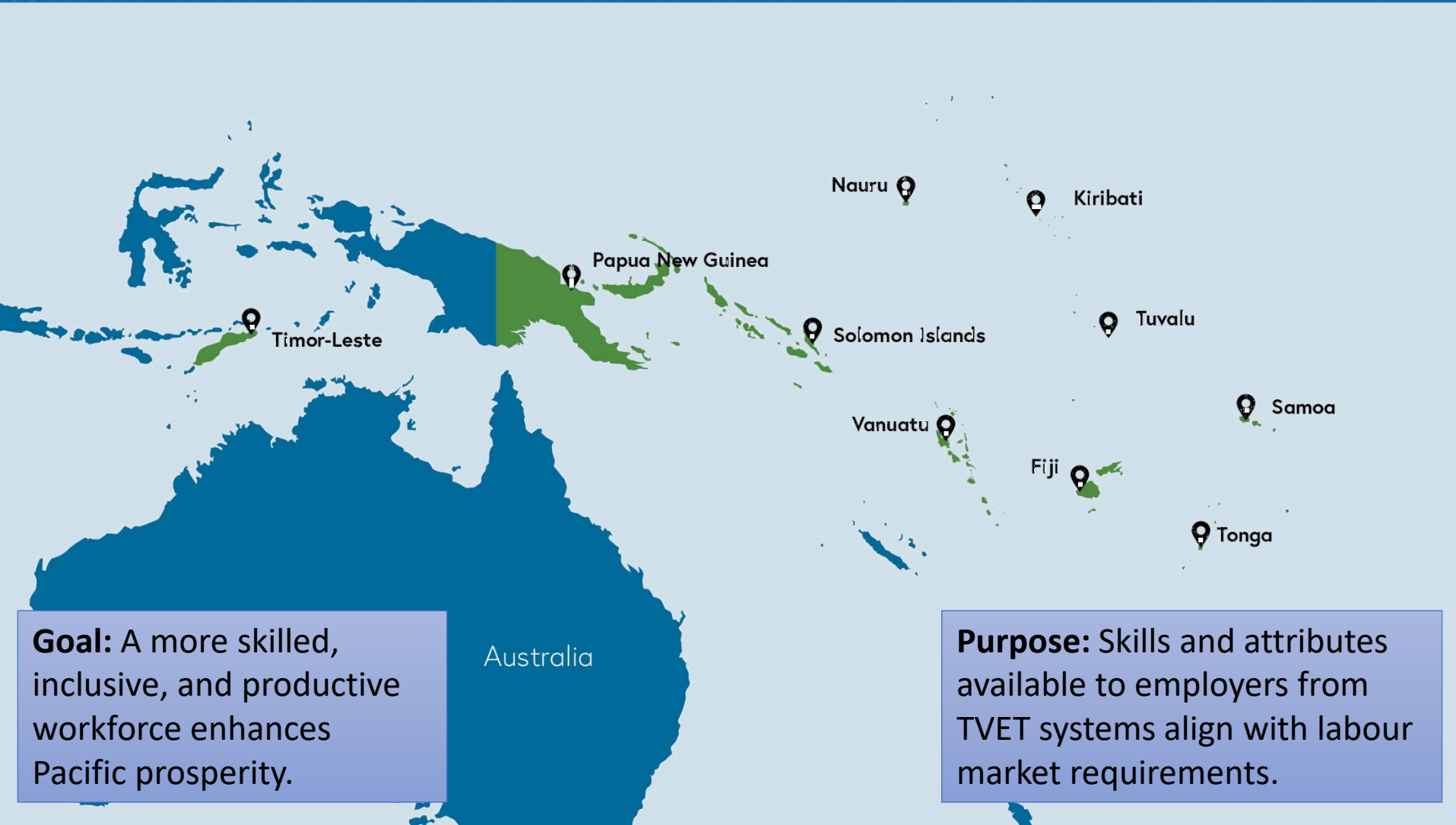

1. APTC and partner graduates have improved employment outcomes.



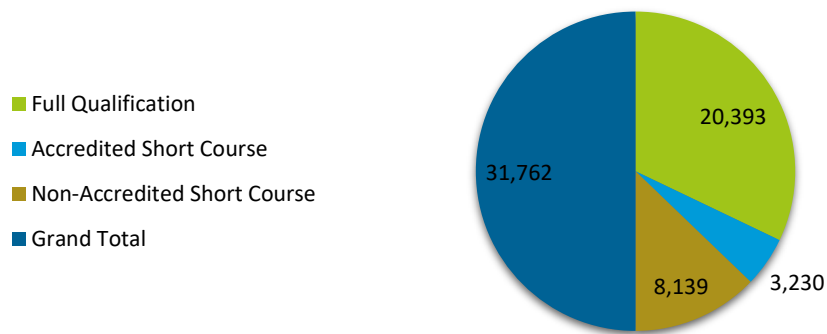
2. Co-investment in skills training increases.



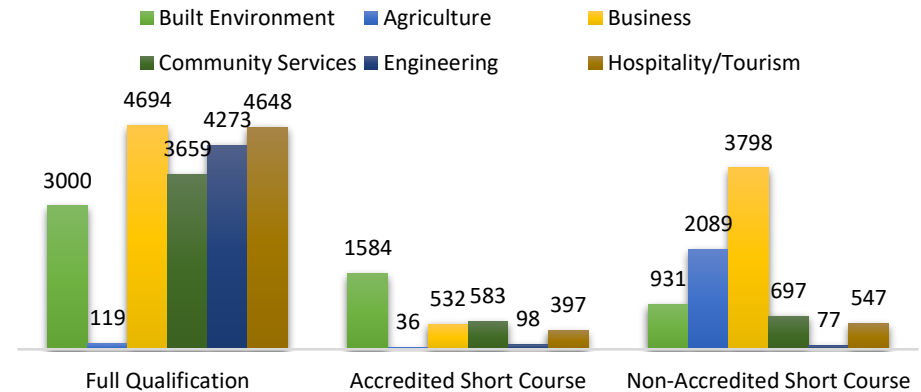

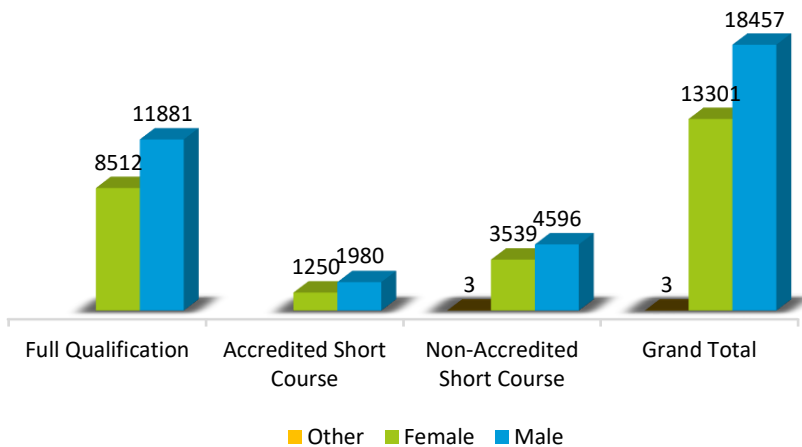
Number of Graduates



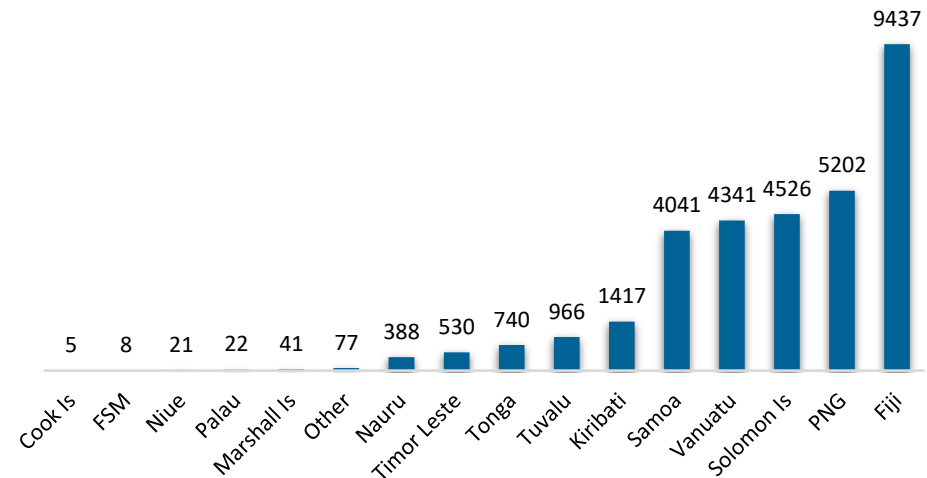
Graduates by Course

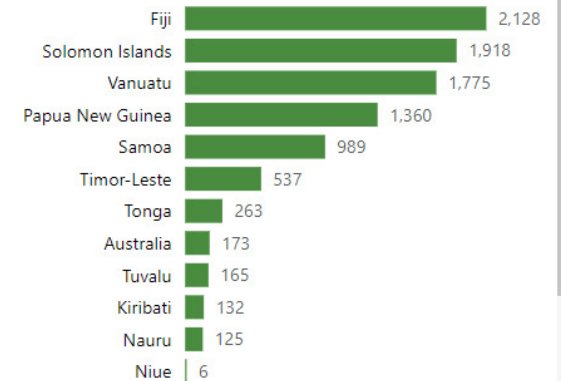

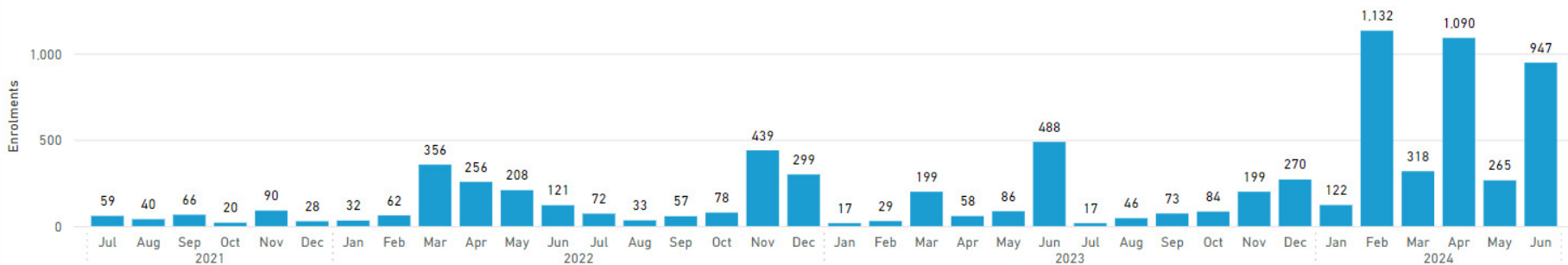

Completions by Month

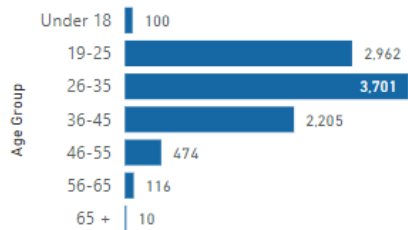

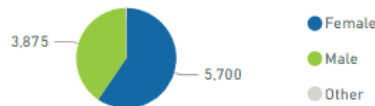

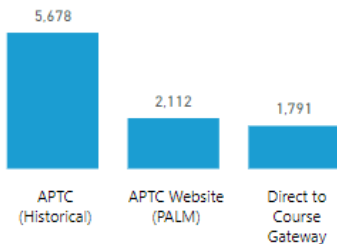
Completions by Age Group



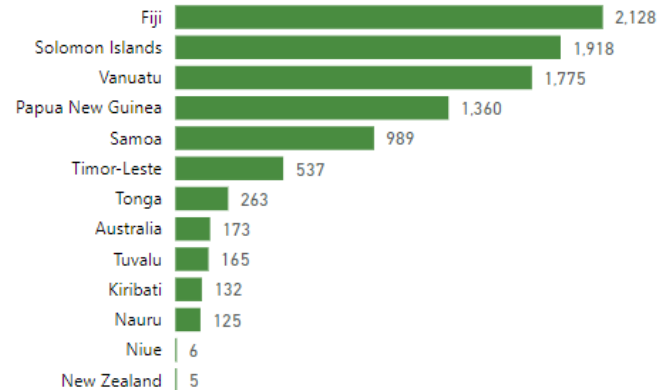
Completions by Gender Identity

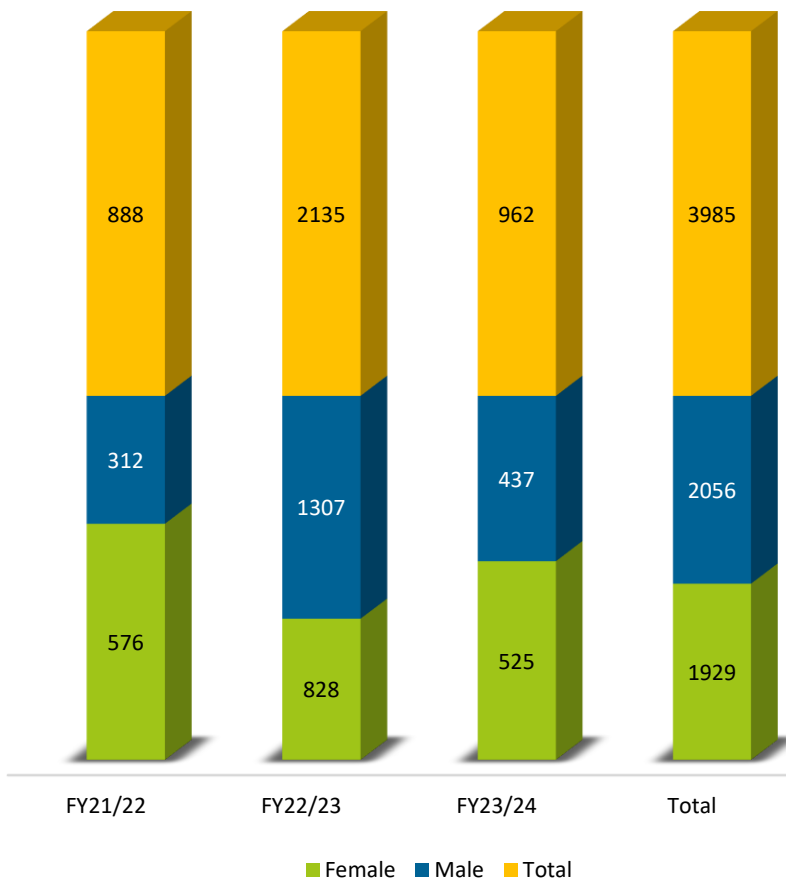
