PACER+ Contact Point?

- PACER Plus Agreement states to have Contact Points in each country.
- A Contact Point is a person who is officially in charge of implementing 4 PACER Plus transparency obligations in regard of 8 topics.
- Depending on the topics, a contact point has different levels of obligations

8 Topics?

- 1. Trade in goods (Chapter 2)
- 2. SPS: Sanitary and phytosanitary measures (Chapter 5)
- 3. TBT: Technical regulations, standard and conformity assessment (Chapter 6)
- 4. Trade in Services (Chapter 7)
- 5. Movement of natural persons (Chapter 8)
- 6. Investment (Chapter 9)
- 7. Development & economic cooperation (Chapter 10)
- 8. Institutional provisions (Chapter 12)

4 Transparency Obligations?

- 1. Communication through, to a Contact Point
- 2. Publication of existing legislation, etc.
- 3. Notification of existing legislation, etc.
- 4. Comment of draft legislation, etc.

Country's Trade Inpormation Portal will help fulfilling these obligations.

Contact points of each topic have different obligations..

Obligation 1.

1. Communication through, to a Contact Point

When an issue arises in regard of one of the previously mentioned topics, the responsible contact point in charge of this topic **must communicate with other countries' contact points** who are in charge of the same topic.

Obligation 2.

2. **Publication** of existing legislation and other information that are related to 4 topics (to the Trade Portal)

UNCTAD is working on with countries TIP Team in populate the TIP. However, Contact Points of the 4 previously mentioned topics should take up this work.

Support from ministries, Parliamentary Services and Crown Law Office is crucial to complete the current work and to transfer know-how for sustainable continuation of the work in the future.

Obligation 2. Cont.

What kind of information should a Contact Point publish?

- SPS Contact Point
 - Legislation to protect human, animal, plant from pest and disease (Biosecurity Act, etc.)
 - Changes in health status, SPS risk of consignment
- TBT Contact point
 - Technical regulation, conformity assessment (Technical standards for mobile phones, etc.)

Obligation 2. Cont.

What kind of information should a Contact Point publish?

- Trade in Goods Contact Point
 - Legislation on fees, charges, trade remedies and any other matters (Customs Act, Excise Tax Act, etc.)
 - Signed international goods agreement (Quarantine Protocol with NZ)
- Trade in Services Contact Point
 - Legislation on licence, qualification, service standards
 (Communication Act, Education Act, etc.)
 - Signed international services agreement

Obligation 2. Cont.

- Once the necessary information has been uploaded into the TIP,
 Contact Points can refer to the legislation tab and see examples of the legislation that they should publish.
 - Example of the legislation tab

Obligation 3.

3. **Notification** of existing legislation, etc. (through the Trade Portal)

When information is published, Contact Points must notify such publication to other countries.

Contact Points can click a 'Save and Notify' button and send a notification email in the Trade Information Portal.

Obligation 4.

4. Comment of draft legislation, etc.

When there is draft legislation related to SPS or TBT, Contact Points must provide other countries with an opportunity to comment.

Contact Points can upload draft legislation and provide details on comment opportunity in the Trade Information Portal.

Operation of Contact Points

- UNCTAD suggests to designate for each topic:
 - 1 high-level officer (e.g CEO, Chief) as a formal Contact Point
 - Assisted by several operational-level officers as day-to-day Contact Points who will:
 - Publish and notify legislation
 - Receive in cc, and reply to emails that are sent to Contact Points
 - Raise awareness of the formal Contact Points when needed

Operation of Contact Points

- A Contact Point must cover every issue related to its topic, not just the issue related to his/her ministry.
- For example: a health Minister became a SPS Contact
 Point. As a Contact Point, he/she must take care of all the
 SPS issues vis-à-vis other countries, even though they are
 regulated by ministries of agriculture, forestry, biosecurity,
 etc. How to achieve inter-ministerial collaboration is up to
 the Contact Point.

Government procedures are displayed step-by-step from start to finish, from a user's point of view. Information includes forms, contacts, costs, duration and legal bases.




Any government procedure can be included


Portals to-date show steps for company creation, obtaining licenses, agricultural certification, importing or exporting.




The first step towards simplification
