

1. Role and significance of tourism in the Cook Islands particularly for international trade (using data to support)

- The Cook Islands is a small open economy dominated by the tourism sector. Tourism makes up an estimated 66% of our gross domestic product (GDP). Restaurants and accommodations are industries within the tourism sector that has the strongest economic contribution. Employment within the tourism sector is another key factor especially for international trade. Cook Islands is always outsourcing to fill in the Labour shortage (PSDI, 2021 & SPTO, 2020).
- High tourist arrivals has driven strong growth in the economy. In 2018 we recorded a total of 164,000 and 2019 we accelerated a new record of an estimated 170,000 tourist arrivals. These figures have since been impacted by the C-19 pandemic.





<u>Analyzing the effects of the C-19 pandemic with the annual</u> total figures of visitor arrivals in the last 5years

Pre-Covid Period

2018 – total arrivals 164,800 2019 – total arrivals 170,000

Covid Period

2020 – total arrivals 30,081 2021 – total arrivals 30,350 2022 – total arrivals 122,154




Figure 1: Visitor Arrivals 2021-2023



Analyzing the effects of the C-19 pandemic with industries in the tourism sector

Employment & Businesses

- Employment within the tourism sector accounts for an estimated 85.9% (LFS, 2019).
- In 2020 an est. 27% of businesses closed as a result of C-19. Over 58% of businesses say their turnover was under 30% of what it was during the same period in the last year.
- In April 2021, 93% of businesses surveyed reported a negative impact due to the pandemic with 90% reporting a decline in revenue (PSDI, 2021).





2. Strategic plans for tourism development in Cook Islands including existing or future development projects

- The current Cook Islands Tourism Destination Strategy (CITDS) aligns with national, regional, and global sustainable development aspirations.
- ► For the Cook Islands the focus of aspirations are:
 - 1. Enhance and Leverage our Visitor Economy
 - 2. Optimize the Visitor's Experience
 - 3. Empower our Tourism Industry
 - 4. Encourage Regenerative Travel
