Tuvalu's National Skills Development Framework

- Tuvalu is a small country with a population of 11,000 and consists of nine small islands scattered over 500,000 sq km of the Western Pacific
- The small size of the country and its vast geographical dispersal pose challenges for education management and skills development
- New government elected in January 2024 new priorities
- Education is compulsory from the age of 6 to 15
- Free education (ECCE, Primary Education and Secondary Education)
- Education reviews currently underway Curriculum Framework, TESP IV, TVSD/TVET Review, Education Act
- Post Secondary training providers local: Tuvalu Maritime Training Institute (TMTI), Tuvalu Atoll Science Technology Training Institute (TASTTI), private training providers.
- Post Secondary International: USP/PacTAFE, APTC, overseas scholarships





Priorities

- Tuvalu Education Sector Plan IV (TESP IV)— still under development, skills development a priority
- * TVET/TVSD review:
 - TVET pathway through school
 - Community Training Centres
 - promoting TVET to girls and boys and also students with disability
 - promoting TVET to parents and community
 - Developing new TVET policy
- Curriculum Framework review
- Further Develop TMTI and TASTTI as post-secondary training providers





Challenges

- Disengaged youth
- Few TVET pathways in Secondary School
- Lack of qualified trainers
- Lack of equipment and resources (eg BCATs program)
- Lack of value attributed to TVET
- TVET is not fully responsive to the demands of the labour market
- Financial resources for Tuvalu's TVET program
- Poor connection of TVET across all education streams
- Limited involvement of stakeholders
