

Maintaining clean sea containers

Sea containers are essential for the movement of cargo around the Pacific but can also carry exotic pests, disease, and contaminants.

If not detected, these pests and contaminants can pose a serious biosecurity risk for importing countries.

What makes for a clean sea container?

Clean sea containers are free of pests and contaminants, like plant and animal material, weeds, seeds, insects, and soil that can hide in or on a container.

What happens to unclean sea containers?

Shipping cargo in unclean sea containers may result in your goods, cargo and container, being stopped on arrival for inspection and cleaning. The treatment process for contaminated containers and cargo takes time, meaning costly delays and added charges.
